 this present thorough the goodness of God in reasonable good health perfect memory
 yet considering the uncertainty of mans life and that this might be for to morrowe
 my Soule may be taken from mee to witness my faith unto the world & obedience
 to Gods direction, to sett my house in order as I doe & to ordaine this my last will and
 Testament in manner & forme followinge. First reflecting on my selfe I find twoe
 thinge to dispose of, my Soule & my Body, the one of a heavenly & spirituall substance
 which in all humility I comend to the Father of spirittes & to the End of all consolation, we
 beseeching him to accept the workmanship of his owne handes, to looke upon it, not as it
 is in it selfe a stuyred & polluted soule with originall sin, But as it is washed & plunged
 with the blood of his dearest sonne, & my plone Saviour. The other parte of mee, my
 body being earthly and corruptible, I comitt to y^e earth from whence it came, to be bur-
 ed decently & without saying to corruption Thou art my Father, & to the wormes Thou art
 my Mother & Sister Nothing doubting, though it be consumed to dust in y^e grave,
 & rot away with wormes yet in ite demerits shall be raised up a glorious body, and by
 the strength of Christ his members shall be reunited to the Soule, when a
 booth together awaiting upon y^e Lamb shall have entrance into the new Jerusalem
 & receive that joyfull welcome, Come ye blessed of my Father take the Kingdome
 prepared for you. Now for my temporall good, which God of his mercy hath lent unto
 mee, I dispose as followeth, I give & bequeath to my brother, Doctor Thomas
 Jaskie his wife & child (as a token of my love) this parralle of my plate following
 to himselfe one spout spott, twoe silver cruette one pepper box & a silver fundle stick
 to my loving sister his wife I give one dozen of silver spoones with a silver dish
 & to little Nan their daughter my three gratefull bowles, Item I give & bequeath
 to my brother Samuell three children William Samuell, & John as followeth, or
 to William their eldest sonne I give & bequeath my whole Librarie of Booke, Also
 my best silver salt with y^e cruettes salt thereunto belonging, Also to him I give
 my standing Bedstead in the y^e Parler Chamber with y^e Bed & Beddinge, that is to
 say one feather bed one bolster twoe willowes, A baystrye, coveringe twoe blankette
 one quilt with a greate chaine, & twoe stools suitable to the bed with y^e bras Andron
 Iron Orerocres & fingshorrells & tonge belonging to that Chamber, To Samuell my brother
 second sonne I give & bequeath three downe quilts & supps, And to his child some John
 Jaskie I give my twoe gratefull silver bowles, And to their Mother Martha my good
 silver as a token of my love, I give one dozen of spoones with gilt heade, Item I give
 to my Nephewes Mr. Nicholas Herne & Mr. John Herne (the sonnes of my sister
 Mrs. Alice Herne) as a token of my love, fortye shillinge a year to make them widge
 Item to my Sisters Junes children, I give & bequeath such parralle of plate as is
 followeth, to my Nephew Richard their eldest sonne I give my best silver
 with twoe parrall gilt spott, & my silver chafin dish, Also that standing Bedstead
 in the same Chamber over the Labe with the Bed & Beddinge therunto appoyning
 that is to say one feather bed one bolster twoe willowes twoe blankette one downe
 wosted rugge one quilte, my second sute of Dama sk, to witt one long Table cloth
 eighteene napkins with a Colbert cloth, sixe napkins, & all my pictures in the y^e Parler
 with my owne that hangen in my Chamber, to my Nephewes daughter Marianne
 I give & bequeath as followeth, My twoe silver out dishes, one silver sandall
 one with a clove one silver spurringe, & one dozen of gilt spoones, Also my best
 sute of Dama sk, with one long Table cloth sixe napkins, one long Colbert
 one large Colbert cloth, one lappes for a side Table, & my best sute of needell worke

 sister had a remembrance of my true affection I give my white silver Canaler, with a
 my silver porringer. To my sister Brunne (as a token of my love) I give unto her
 forty shillinge to make her a ring Also I give unto my sister Bradshawe some
 hundred if shee survive mee. To my servant James Braddocke for her true
 faithfull service I give a bequeath as followeth. In many Twenty pounde, in plate
 on of my smale beere Bowles, on white wine Duffion, my ordinary silver Salte & a
 sixe silver spoones without head Also I give unto her twoe Iron potte that is to say
 the lesser of my twoe greater ones & one of the littell ones, on roott potte & another of a
 brass the greater &opper littell with a lesser littell of Iron & my Potter & also
 give her on dozen spares, twoe of each sort except the largest with on dozen of Duffion
 & on dozen of plate. Moreover on paye of potter Duffion with a pade of brass, &
 a brass shafing dish. For my Dary I give her on three Duffion on tharme Duffion on my
 Duffion. For my Duffion on my Duffion & on faulting Duffion. To her also I give twoe of my
 Duffion on hogge with twoe shott. Also in my dwelling house, to namly in my little
 Parlor I give her the drawing Table there in the side. Duffion with sixe Duffion

 into the hande of Steven Wally Barnaby ffreeman & Richard Kottage John Brouell
 & William ffreeman of Churchthorpe to be employed as afore said or in any other waye
 they shall thinke fitt for my beneffitt of the poore children, soe they advise with my
 Lord, Myward, & his grace his consent therunto. Also I give unto the poore
 of Mydon twenty nobles to be distributed the next Sabbath day after my death or
 buriall by those forenamed Inhabitant according to the good directione desiring
 them to enlarge their benevolence in such poore ffamilies where they finde most
 honest & most Industrie for that is true Charity No for the remainder of my
 Estate whether in money lande bills debte, moveables or what else soever (my
 Requyres & full charge & charges) I leave unto the truste of my Executors
 Namely my loving brother Doctor Thomas Paske, my Nephew Mr. Richard
 & some some of my sister Jane Berne My moveables & bequeatheth to be sold
 And then the whole remainder of my Estate to be divided by them my Executors
 to my Brother John Paske six some Namely John Emethie Thomas Robert
 William & Henry not by equall portions, but to them most who take good comfort
 & contentment in their dwellinge And left to them that doe the contrarye No my
 Executors shall thinke fitt And further my will is that this parte of my Estate
 to my brother John six children thus bequeatheth be delivered unto them at such
 times & on such occasions as my abovesaid Executors shall see most as we
 becom full for them & not otherwise And this I make my last will & Testament
 In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand & seale the day of the date
