I Henry Ousnam after all my debts and sundry charges are discharged doe give and bequeath
the remaynder of what I have left to three persons hereunder written. To Richard
Martin my brother in law if he be living five pence. To Henry Elstham my
kinsman if he be living five shillings To Elizabeth Elstham my kinswoman if
she be unmarried five shillings To Mr. Alkison whom I desire to see all their
things performed a ring of twenty shillings. To his wife M^{rs} Alkison my
silver watch and a ring of twenty shillings To M^{rs} Jane Alkison a ring
of ten shillings To M^{rs} Forland Thomas a ring of ten shillings To El-
izabeth Shuckby ten shillings To the minister that visiteth me in my sick-
ness and buryeth me twenty shillings To the poor of the parish of Lynby
after their Exoratory and all my sundry charges are paid the whole that
remayneth This I acknowledge to be the last will and testament of me a

god doe make this my last will and testament in manner and forme following
First I commend my soule into the hands of Almighty god who gave
it trusting to be saved by the merits of Jesus Christ my gracious Saviour and
redeemer my body I commit to the ground decently to be buried according to
the discretion of my executor hereafter named And for my worldly goods where-
with I hath pleased god to bless me I doe dispose in manner and forme following
Item I will and bequeath unto my sonne Thomas Paske for and about what I
have given him already all my right title and interest after the death of my exor-
tor hereafter mentioned All the title and interest which any hand or may challenge
to have in trust for me in the parish of the Parsonage of Wratby in the County of
Lincoln belonging unto All Saints in Cambridge And after the said interest and
right in the said parish of Wratby grounds lying in Much Hadham in the County of
Hertford

York and elsewhere lately of Gilbert Lord Bishop of London bearing date the
Eighth day of August 1661 ad likewise all the said interest in the right of the
lordship house and lands thereto belonging lying in Mark Hadham above said
Item 5 gms and bequeath unto my said son Thomas all my books excepting
some such English books as my executor shall choose of for his own private use
And in case my said son Thomas shall dye without issue male I will and bequeath
the said books to my said son George and in case my said son George dye without issue
male I will and bequeath the said books to my Nephew Mr William Paske Item
I will and bequeath to my daughter Theophila Paske all my right Dyll and
interest whith I have by way of Mortgage in the Manor of Westow and other lands
lying in the County of York ad as pertaineth by deed of bargain Sale and lease
made or intended to be made between me Thomas Paske and George Mornlague
Esquire bearing date fourth day of April 1661 Item I will and bequeath unto my
daughter Judith five hundred pounds to be paid by my executor when she shall
attayne the age of one and twenty years or at the day of her marriage which
shall first happen And in the mean tyme my executor to allow her for her
maintenance thirty pounds per annum After 5 gms unto my said daughter
Judith three hundred pounds out of the the some of one thousand pounds due to
me by way of fine to be raised out of the profits of the lease of the Duchin Manor
Manor and lordship of Ellscliffe in the County of York ad more at large appear
eth by an Indenture bearing date the Twentieth day of September 1661
made or intended to be made between me the said Thomas Paske of the
one parte Joseph Henric of Duncalms Esquire and Thomas Paske my
sonne of the other parte to be paid my daughter Judith by my executor ad
she shall receive it when she shall attayne the age of one and twenty years
Item I will and bequeath unto my said son George five hundred pounds to be paid
by my executor when he shall attayne the age of one and twenty years And
in the mean tyme my executor to allow him for his maintenance twelve
and five pounds per annum After 5 gms unto my said son George the some
of three hundred pounds out of the aforesaid thousand pounds due to me by
way of fine to be raised out of the profits of the lease of the Duchin Man
or and lordship of Ellscliffe in the County of York ad more at large appear
eth by the Indenture above mentioned bearing date the Twentieth Sept 1661 And
be paid unto my said son George by my executor ad she shall receive it
when he shall attayne the age of one and twenty years And the residue of the afove
said thousand pounds being seven hundred pounds I will and bequeath unto all
my children to be equally divided amongst them ad well those who are in this
my will ad not And my further will is that in case any of my three children
vizt Theophila Judith or George shall happen to departe this life before they shall
attayne the age of one and twenty years that then the portions bequeathed unto them
by this my will shall be equally divided amongst the rest of my children And I do here
by make witness and approve my loving wife Mrs Anne Paske sole executrix of
this my last will and testament And my will is that she shall have the yearly benefit
of all those my houses heretofore bequeathed unto my said son Thomas Paske for and
during her natural life by my said executor performing all the conditions and co
venants and truly observed upon any of the said leases and after performing all the
covenants therein contained And the rest of all my goods not herein mentioned my debts and
Innecall charges deducted 5 gms and bequeath wholly and totally to my said execu
trix And I do hereby revoke all other former wills and testaments heretofore made
by me witness my hand and Seale the Twentieth day of September 1662 Item 5
gms to be divided amongst the poor of the parish of Mark Hadham five
pounds immediately after my death This is the will of Thomas Paske
